- Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the **95th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **28.06.2024** and the **Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, However, the college is fulfilling the criteria required for issuance of conditional permission as per the Regulation 3 (3) of MSR 2016.** Hence, Board decided to issue the **Conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.**
- Therefore, **Conditional Permission is issued to Government Ayurved College, Vazirabad, Nanded, Maharashtra (Inst. Id- AYU0185) with 100 seats (125 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 46 seats (58 seats including EWS) in 12 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sankrit & Siddhanta-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (ii) Drayaguna Vigyana-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iii) Kayachikitsa- 04 seats (05 seats including EWS) (iv) Kriya Sharir -06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (v) Shalakya-05 seats (06 seats including EWS) (vi) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana-02 seats (02 seats including EWS) (vii) Rog Nidan-Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (viii) Rachna Sharir-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) (ix) Swasthavritta-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (x) Prasut & Stri Roga-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (xi) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-06 seats (07 seats including EWS) (xii) Shalaya-06 seats (07 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2024-25, subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -**
 - It is further informed that **minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats (125 seats including EWS) and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 46 seats (58 seats including EWS) in 12 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
 - Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020,** The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
 - Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016
- iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
- v) **The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2.**

9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
